DRESS CODE FOR ADVANCED FULLER SCHOOL OF MASSAGE THERAPY

The intention of the administration is to present a positive image of massage therapy to the public. Our school is not a clinical setting. Therefore, we feel it is not necessary to wear medical attire. Professional appearance is our main goal and a neat, clean health care look is mandatory.

All THERAPISTS AND STUDENTS WILL WEAR THE FOLLOWING:

Acceptable Attire

Dress Shirts or Collared Shirts (to be tucked in) Short Sleeves are recommended

Dress Slacks, Dress Shorts or Skirts for Ladies (Pressed and Professional)

All shorts must be no shorter than five inches from knees

All clothes should be modest, clean and pressed

Fingernails must be trimmed at all times for customer comfort

Long Flowing Skirts and Dresses (Spandex can be worn under)

Non-Acceptable Attire

The following are deemed Non-Acceptable Jeans, Tee-shirts, Sweatshirts, Spandex, Open Toe Shoes, Sandals, Boots, and Exposed Tattoos. **Visible Body Piercing - Male** - No visible body piercing allowed. **Female**- The only acceptable exposed piercing is to the ear with a maximum of 3 to each ear. All Studs should only be above the ear lobe.

No tank tops or jean shorts will be permitted.

You may remove your shoes in the Massage Room, but they must be worn all other times.

The above requirements also apply when representing Advanced Fuller School at such events as on-sites, health fairs, etc. First impressions are everything; we are all professionals!!

Mouthwash and a thorough washing of hands is a must. If you smoke, remember smoke stays on clothes and please hand wash up to your elbows. No smoking ½ hour before any appointment.

No hair color, dress or accessories that are considered unusual or unprofessional by an instructor or the desk staff.
